REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee and Citizens:

I submit herewith my fifth annual report of the financial condition of the schools together with an outline of school conditions and recommendations for next year.

Early last Fall, a letter was received from the

State Department telling us that Island Falls High School must provide an additional teacher to maintain its Class "A" rating. Loss of this rating would make the charging of tuition illegal and make it impossible, for that reason, to collect any money. No choice was given but to provide an additional teacher. With the beginning of the second semester in February, therefore an additional teacher was hired for the high school. This addition to the faculty was a long step forward as far as the eighth and seventh grades go. Heretofore little spelling, writing and reading was formally taught in the Junior High School.

Miss Isabel Buck, this new teacher, is a graduate of Farmington, has attended Worcester State Teachers' College and has completed an Extension course in education from the University of Maine. She is a capable teacher of nine years experience.

Miss Alice Bocquel, a graduate of Colby in 1936, is another new teacher to Island Falls. She is unusually well qualified to teach her subject—French—because of the fact that her parents formerly lived in France and she learned to speak the French language when a child. Under Miss Bocquel truly fine progress has been made in this branch of our schools.

Mr. Cough, for the past six years sub-master, was advanced to the Principalship upon the resignation of Mr. Abbott last Spring. He has shown unusual skill as an administrator. The school functions smoothly and the high standards of the school have been steadily advanced under his leadership.

John B. Jasper was secured to fill the vacancy by Mr. Cough's promotion. Mr. Jasper has taught for nine years, is a graduate of Washington State Normal school in the three year course, followed by three summer sessions, two at Bates and one at Boston

University. His training is unusually good for the Junior High position he holds.

These additions together with the high skill of the teachers who returned to Island Falls High, Miss Bliss and Miss Chase, makes this faculty rank with the highest in the secondary field. This is really a sincere statement and is amply born out by the facts when measured by tests and other comparisons.

The addition of another teacher in the High School, made possible a much broader program of activities. The Home Economics apparatus is now being used in the Home Ec. Club, a popular activity and one much worthwhile. This club is now paying for two additional sewing machines. The Manuel Training equipment is now being used by the Manuel Arts Club where the boys of the school have formed a club to develop hobbies and skills in this line of work. The old commercial equipment is now busy in the hands of the Commercial Club. So great was the requests for enrollment in this club that additional typewriters have been purchased and will be paid for by the club. In addition there is an active Press Club that issues a mimeographed school paper; two Glee Clubs for those who enjoy singing and the School Orchestra. As a school superintendent, I am very proud of this school and highly appreciative of the endless time and energy the teachers give to the school.

Common Schools

The only big change here this year was the moving of the sixth grade from the high school building to the grade building. This makes for a unified program and routine. The new series of readers introduced a year ago, is now beginning to bear real fruit

and our reading in the lower grades is of high standard.

In the teaching force, Miss Hunt is now the permanent sixth grade teacher, filling the vacancy caused by the resignation of Miss Webb last Spring. The small turn-over in the common school teaching force is a valuable asset and the professional interest of this group continues to be of high order. In spite of large enrollments per grade, I do not feel that we have any real problem in the common schools, largely because of the skill of the teachers.

Suggestions

The high school building could be made much more workable, by the providing of chairs in one of the assembly rooms and the moving of the pupils' desks to other rooms making "Home Rooms" for three classes. This would provide the school with a fine place for programs and assemblies.

While the clubs, above described under the High School, have not requested financial aid from the town, some slight appropriation from the town to help them would be money well spent. One Hundred Dollars would go a long ways towards providing much needed equipment for these clubs.

Speaking for the teaching force and all employees, we are sincere in expressing our liking of the town and the positions we hold and in the hopes of doing better, earnestly seek suggestions and criticisms from the parents and friends of the schools that may help us improve what we are trying to do.

STATE OF MAINE

Aroostook ss.

To John J. Marr, one of the Constables of the Town
of Island Falls in said County,

Greeting :

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Island Falls, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to assemble at Community Hall in said Town, on the fifteenth day of March A. D. 1937, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1 To elect a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2 To elect a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3 To elect a Board of three Selectmen, and all other necessary Town officers.

Art. 4 To see if the Town will vote to elect a Road Commissioner, or leave his appointment to the Selectmen.

Art. 5 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the maintenance of Common Schools: including teachers' salaries, fuel, janitor service, and conveyance of scholars.

Art. 6 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Free High School.

Art. 7 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for text books, insurance, lights, and apparatus and supplies.

Art. 8 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for General Government as follows: Selectmen, Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, health officer, and all other miscellaneous expenses.

Art. 9 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Hydrant rentals and fire department.

Art. 10 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Street Lighting.

Art. 11 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the care of cemeteries.

Art. 12 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the Anti-Tuberculosis Society.

Art. 13 To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of highways, ways, and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chap. 132 P. L. 1935.

Art. 14 To see, what sum, if any, the Town would recommend to take from the joint state aid fund for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to state aid roads in excess of the requirements of Sec. 2 Chap. 132 P. L. 1935.

Art. 15 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for patrolling state, and state aid highways.

Art. 16 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the repair of roads and bridges, and snow removal.

Art. 17 To see what sum of money the Town

will vote to grant and raise for the repair of, and maintenance of, Third Class Highways.

Art. 18 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Mothers' Aid.

Art. 19 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the support of poor.

Art. 20 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for maintenance of Town farm.

Art. 21 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for payment of principal of Town Debt.

Art. 22 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for interest on Town debt.

Art. 23 To see if the Town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$75.00, or more for school nursing to be expended under the auspices of the State Department of Health and Welfare. As the amount of the appropriation increases the service will be proportionately increased.

Art. 24 To see if the Town will vote to raise, and raise a sum equal to ten cents per capita or \$140.00 to be expended and used for advertising the recreational advantages and attractions, natural resources and industrial possibilities of Aroostook County, the Town and the State of Maine, the same to be expended through the Aroostook Development Association, Incorporated.

Art. 25 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for abatements and discounts.

Art. 26 To see if the Town will ratify and confirm as debts of the Town the sum of \$6,200.00 in notes now held by Katahdin Trust Company, and

§2,000.00 in notes held by Geo. W. York, and to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to execute in the name and behalf of said Town any renewals of said notes.

Art. 27 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to bring writs of entry for the recovery and possession of such parcels of real estate as has been acquired by the Inhabitants of said Town for non-payment of taxes and the time of redemption having expired.

Art. 28 To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer under the direction of the Selectmen for such sums of money as said Selectmen may see fit to accept therefor, to sell and convey all the right, title, and interest in and to such parcels of real estate as the Town has acquired by tax deeds or tax liens, and to authorize the Treasurer to execute and deliver said deeds.

Art. 29 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the observance of Memorial Day, and to appoint a committee to expend the same.

Art. 30 To see if the Town will vote to fix a time when property taxes are due and payable; also to see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid at such time, or times, as it may determine, and if so, what per cent.

Art. 31 To see if the Town will vote to have its tax collector settle in full for all taxes committed to him for collection, and to fix the time therefor.

Art. 32 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the tax collector to accept Town orders in payment of taxes.

Art. 33 To see if the Town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$144.00 for interest on school fund.

Art. 34 To see if the Town will vote to elect, and elect a lady member of the Board of Mothers' aid.

Art. 35 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the repair of school houses.

Art. 36 To see if the Town will vote to ratify the doings of the Selectmen whereby they have abated certain taxes as appear in the Town report.

Art. 37 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money for and in behalf of the Town to pay debts contracted in the ensuing year in anticipation of taxes assessed for the ensuing year, not to exceed \$5,000.00. Also to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to sign notes therefor, and deliver and negotiate the same for and in behalf of the Town for the purposes aforesaid.

Art. 38 To see if the Town will vote to accept, and to hold the same in trust, the sum of \$100.00 to be donated by Dr. William A. Small of Caribou, the income thereof to be used in caring for and maintaining the Small lot in Island Falls cemetery.

Art. 39 To see if the Town will vote to refund to Geo. H. Donham Jr., such sum as the Town may see fit to grant and raise, to reimburse to him and refund taxes assessed upon the Donham Farm which has for a long period of time included in the assessment of a lot of land now owned by the Great Northern Paper Company.

Art. 40 To see if the Town will vote to establish Day Light Saving Time.

Art. 41 To see if the Town will vote to accept the Town Report as printed.

Art. 42 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for School Physician.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Community Hall on March 15th., 1937, at nine o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the list of voters and hearing applications for those having the right to vote.
