

AUDITOR'S REPORT

CASH

To Superintendent Laurence P. Bagley and the School Committee of Island Falls, I wish to submit my first report as principal of Island Falls High School.

I wish to express my appreciation to the superintendent, school committee and townspeople for their splendid co-operation and support of the high school this year.

For a small rural High School, we are indeed fortunate to have such a high professional calibre of teachers on our faculty this year. This accounts for the high morale and spirit of co-operation which is essential to any school.

At present we offer four courses in the High School, College, Commercial, Agriculture, and General. But with the completion of the gym, and as other facilities permit, we are in hopes to be able to offer Home Economics and Physical Education. These courses will enable us to offer at least one vocational course to all students in addition to academic subjects.

We feel very proud of our library which compares very favorably with those of other schools throughout the state. The large number of books in the library is due in a large part to the efforts of Mrs. Harding and the generosity of the townspeople and others. We are especially grateful to the Pine Needle Club for their gift of \$100 with which we purchased fluorescent lights and a new table. We should also like to thank Miss Demaris Merriman, formerly of Island Falls, Reverend and Mrs. George Brookes of Rockville, Connecticut, and Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Brookes of Manchester, Connecticut, for their generous donations of books. We also wish to express our appreciation to the many organizations and individuals who have made contributions of books and magazines to the library.

Mr. Emmons Robinson has been giving individual instruction to the students who are interested in playing an instrument. This work is slightly behind schedule this year because of the serious illness of Mr. Robinson. However, in the near future Mr. Robinson plans to consolidate the group into a band and we may expect to have a band concert early in the spring.

The program of so-called extra-curricular activities has been very successful this year. The boys' basketball team placed second in the Katahdin Valley League and participated in the Aroostook tournament. The girls team, although not quite so successful, has improved remarkably. Much of the credit is due to their respective coaches, Mr. Morrison and Miss Lewis. In the field of dramatics we have already presented two one-act plays and are in the process of preparing the Katahdin Valley league one act play and the senior play.

The High School speaking contest will be held March 31, the winners of which will compete in the league contest April 13. The debating team has had a great deal of success

winning the Aroostook tournament and reaching the semifinals at the University of Maine.

During the past few years the Student Council has raised a sum of money to buy curtains and drapes for the stage in the new gym and is now investigating the cost of materials in preparation for furnishing the stage with drapes. We wish to thank the townspeople for their support of our many projects during the school year.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Island Falls:

It is a real pleasure to submit this, my sixth, annual report concerning the condition of your school system.

The outstanding event of the year is the building of the Auditorium-Gymnasium. Mrs. Shur and all who contributed so generously of money, time and materials should feel that they have made a real contribution to the welfare of the children and young people of the community. The building will be used for many purposes and will add much to the educational facilities of the school. Care must be used to see that all have opportunity to use the building, but that none misuse it.

We again have the same force of teachers in the Houlton Street School. The continuity is good, as each teacher has an opportunity to know what the pupils have had in the previous grade, and so knows the needs of each. Several of the teachers have taken extension courses given by the University of Maine, and this reflects in the classroom.

Methods and aims of education are changing, and it is necessary that we keep up with the new ideas.

In the High School there are several new teachers. Principal Chester Willette, Coach Roland Morrison, Miss Dorothy Lewis, and in the Junior High, Mrs. Anna Greenlaw, are all new. All are well trained for their respective positions, and all are doing well. Mrs. Harding, Mrs. Quinlan and Mrs. Banton are doing their usual fine work. The spirit in the school is good and the scholastic attainment seems to be excellent. Mr. Robinson has missed some time from the band because of illness, but is back, and we hope he is able to continue with us. The younger members of the band are progressing well, and we should soon have a band to be proud of.

There is more interest amoung the lower grade boys in Agriculture and the course is of much value. It is hoped that soon it will be possible to have Domestic Arts for the girls. With the gymnasium ready to use now, it would be possible to use the present assembly room for such a course with adequate facilities. Such a course means much to a school, and should be offered as soon as possible. Teachers have been practically impossible to obtain, but with both the University of Maine and Farmington graduating girls in this course, it should be possible to get a good teacher now. The cost of such a course is shared by the federal government, as is that of the Agriculture course.

Repairs for the next year should consist of weatherstripping a few more windows, putting lights in a few more rooms, and doing a little interior painting. It will be necessary to buy a few seats soon.

Mr. Willette's report covers the High School and Grades 7 and 8. The enrollment for Grades 1 to 6 is as follows:

- Art. 7 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the teaching of the vocational training in Agriculture.
- Art. 8 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Text Books, Apparatus and Supplies, and Insurance on School buildings and their contents.
- Art. 9 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for School Physician.
- Art. 10 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the Repairs of School Buildings
- Art. 11 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for General Government as follows, Selectmen, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Town Manager, Health Officer, and all other necessary Town Officers, and miscellaneous town expenses.
- Art. 12 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for a School Band.
- Art. 13 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Hydrant Rentals.
- Art. 14 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Street Lighting.

- Art. 15 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the care of Cemetery and the laying out of the new Cemetery lot.
- Art. 16 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the Anti-Tuberculosis Society.
- Art. 17 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the repair of roads and bridges.
- Art. 18 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant for snow removal and sanding roads in winter season.
- Art. 19 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for placing position of snow fencing and removal of the same, and for the purpose of buying new snow fences.
- Art. 20, To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Construction in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and bridges, under the provisions of Chap. 36 Sections 25 and 29 of the Revised Statutes of 1944 as amended.
- Art. 21 To see what sum of money the Town will vote for the support of poor.
- Art. 22 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Aid to Dependent Children.

- Art. 23 To see if the Town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$82.00 for Public health nursing. The same to be expended by the Bureau of Health for local service.
- Art. 24 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Police officer.
- Art. 25 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for repairs of the roads leading to the cottages at Pleasant Lake.
- Art. 26 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for abatements and discounts.
- Art. 27 To see what money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Town Dump.
- Art. 28 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for Maine Publicity Bureau.
- Art. 29 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the Katahdin Public Library.
- Art. 30 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise for the Fire Department.
- Art. 31 To see if the Town will vote to fix a time when taxes shall be due and payable, and also see if the Town will vote to grant a discount upon property taxes, paid at such time or times as the Town may determine, and if so at what rate of per cent: also to see if the Town will vote to charge interest on all taxes unpaid at such time as the Town may determine and to the rate per cent.

- Art. 32 To see if the Town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$500.00 for the use and benefit of the Milliken Memorial Hospital.
- Art. 33 'To see if the Town will vote to allow Sunday Basketball in the School Gymnasium.
- Art. 34 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectman to bring writ of entry for the recovery and possession of such real estate as has heretofore been acquired by the Town by non-payment of taxes and time of redemption having expired.
- Art. 35 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer under the written direction of the Selectmen for such sums of money as said Selectmen may see fit to accept therefor, sell and convey all the right, title, and interest in and to such parcels of land as the Town has acquired ax deeds or tax liens, and authorize the Town Treasurer to sign, acknowledge, and deliver in the name and behalf of the Town deeds therefor.
- Art. 36 To see if the Town will vote to adopt Daylight Saving Time.
- Art. 37 To see if the Town will vote to have its collector of taxes to settle in full for all taxes committed to him for collection on or before Feb. 20, 1951.
- Art. 38 To see if the Town will vote to ratify the doings of the Selectmen whereby they have abated certain taxes as appear in the Town report.

Art. 39 To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow as a temporary loan for the payment of debts contracted during year to be paid out of the taxes assessed for the current year: said Selectmen are hereby authorized to sign, execute, and deliver notes therefor and to fix the amount and rate of interest therefor.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at said School Gymnasium on said twentieth day of March 1950 at nine o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the list of voters and hearing applications for the right to vote.
