## MAYOR'S ADDRESS.

---

*Gentlemen of the Council:*

It is very pleasant to greet the members of last year's council who have been re-elected for the present year, and to extend a hearty welcome and a cordial greeting to the new members. The retiring council has rendered most excellent service to the City and I wish to take this opportunity to thank you all for the kind consideration you all have shown toward me and the harmonious and business like way you have transacted the affairs of the City the past year.

It has been a pleasure to sit with you in Council and to have the work of the City carried on so smoothly.

We have been selected by a majority of the voters of South Portland to assume the responsibilities of conducting the business of this City for the ensuing year, and are now prepared to take council together concerning our duties and how we may best discharge them for the permanent well being of our beloved City.

It is our duty to provide means with which to maintain our schools, to care for our roads, streets, bridges and sewers, as well as to feed and clothe the dependent poor in our midst; and to carry on the business affairs of the City in that careful and economical manner that will induce new industries and the builders of new homes to locate here.

In due season we shall be called upon to pass the annual appropriation bill by which the various departments will be furnished with the necessary funds with which to carry on the work of the several departments, and that you may have a better idea of what is needed, I will ask the heads of the several departments to submit to the City Council their plans for the ensuing year and the estimated cost of financing the same.

In the year just closed, we were obliged to cut the appropriation in some departments to so small a margin that it took considerable planning to get through the year without leaving an overdraw. But I am in hopes that during the present year we may have more funds to do with without

raising the rate of taxation, which I consider too high now for a prosperous and growing city and hope this year to be able to materially reduce the same.

### Finances.

In order that we may enter upon our duties with a clear understanding of the financial condition of our City, I will submit the following facts, which I have obtained from the Treasurer's books, for your consideration.

### RESOURCES.

There is due the City for uncollected taxes from 1899 to 1911, \$23,898.14.

There must be paid from this year's appropriation or by issuing notes or bonds the sum of \$66,105.46 as shown above.

### Valuation.

The present valuation as shown by the Assessor's returns is \$3,665,249.00, which shows an increase over last year's valuation of \$130,367.00.

### Taxation.

This is a subject in which all of our citizens are deeply interested. It seems to me that the real estate is bearing an unjust proportion of the burden of taxation, and that a great part of the personal property escapes being taxed. I do not wish you to think I am criticizing the Assessors for I believe if any officials earn their money, these men do. I think they should receive salary enough so that they may devote more

time in searching the public records which are open for inspection and it is my desire that the Assessors find time and opportunity to plot the real estate property on maps furnished by the Commissioner of Public Works, as this would be a great value to the City and convenience to real estate dealers and would materially assist in the improvements, which we are endeavoring to accomplish the present year.

### **Public Works.**

In this department we have eighty odd miles of streets and roads to look after as well as sidewalks, sewers, culverts and bridges. To keep this system in repair without doing any permanent work, outside of the paving, which I will speak of later, is about all the appropriation will provide for.

The State Road which was built from Knightville to the Town Line of Cape Elizabeth has practically had nothing done on it since it was built and the surface has worn off and in fact, is in about the same condition and no better than the other roads about the town.

### **New Bridge.**

Last year I appointed a committee to draft a bridge bill to be presented to the legislature, now in session, and to take such action in regard to the same as they deemed for the best interests of the City. The committee has been very energetic in their endeavors and the progress made is gratifying at this time.

The bridge bill has been presented and is referred to the committee on Ways and Bridges, and there is to be a hearing before said committee, Thursday of this week, and we are hoping for favorable action on the same by the legislature.

The consummation of this would be the means of providing one of the greatest improvements our City has had in years.

There was constructed last year a new reinforced concrete bridge over Mill Creek, so called, which has greatly improved Cottage Street, and I recommend that the Council provide funds in their appropriation bill for the paving of Cottage Street from the present termination of the paving to Highland Avenue in connection with the paving to be done by the Portland Railroad Company, as they contemplate relaying



the paving on Ocean Street from the Power House to Cottage Street, and to newly pave such portion of Cottage Street as they occupy to Highland Avenue.

We shall then have completed a main thoroughfare from the terminal of the contemplated new bridge through Knightville, so called, to Highland Avenue.

Before this new work is undertaken, we expect the Municipal Light & Power Company to have their gas mains laid before the re-surfacing of the streets begin.

### **Sprinkling.**

Health, convenience and comfort, make it necessary that Ocean and Cottage Streets should be sprinkled during certain seasons, and after these streets have been repaved, which we hope will be accomplished prior to the coming of our summer visitors, I hope to make a beginning this year by sprinkling these thoroughfares.

### **Fire Department.**

I have the greatest regard for the Volunteer Hose Companies, which constitute our fire protection. It is due them that our losses have been kept to a minimum. Their work is so well known that it is not necessary for me to dwell longer upon this subject, and I believe that it is only a question of a short time before the City of South Portland will be obliged to take the responsibility upon themselves and provide suitable apparatus for the fighting of fires in the several wards.

### **Police.**

In this department our appropriations were reduced last year to nine hundred dollars, which is not more than half the amount needed to properly police the City during the summer months. We were fortunate in maintaining good order and protecting property which made it possible for us to accomplish this result without an overdraw.

### **Poor Department.**

The caring for unfortunates in our midst has been carried on this year in a way which commands my respect. The management I believe is doing the best that can be done under the circumstances. The conditions at the City Home

are excellent. One of the overseers informs me that it will be necessary to have the Home enlarged, and departments maintained for males and females, in order that the best results may be obtained.

### **Schools.**

Of the various departments over which this Council has control, this one may be termed the most important. In our schools we are educating the boys and girls of today, who are to be the men and women of the future and much depends upon the character and the quality of the education that they receive at our hands.

The primary object of an education is to enable the boys and girls to be self-supporting and of use in the world. The public schools should aim to teach that which will be most useful and beneficial to the greatest number of pupils. We can never accomplish this object in any better way than by offering courses in our public schools which fit the boy for the farm, the shop, the factory, and the store; the girl for the home. We have as a rule, good schoolhouses. The sanitary conditions of some of them need attention and the repairing of the Pleasant Street Schoolhouse is recommended by the School Committee this year.

The congested condition of the High School calls for a new building as soon as the City is in condition to build one, and this matter ought not to be delayed a great length of time but in our present condition it is deemed inadvisable to take any action at this time.

### **In Conclusion.**

And now, gentlemen, we are brought face to face with our duties. I wish for your harmony and wisdom of thought and the desire to carry out your honest convictions so that at the close of your term of office, you will not only receive the approval of your fellow citizens, but that nobler reward, the inward consciousness of having done your whole duty at all times.

GENTLEMEN:—In accordance with the custom and requirements of the office of City Electrician, I have the honor to report to you as follows:

I have inspected the inside wiring for light and power of twenty-nine new buildings and sixty-eight finished buildings.

Twenty-four buildings have been rewired to conform to the rules of the Board of Fire Underwriters.

The trouble in the Broadway school building caused by the fixtures not being properly insulated from the ceiling, has been corrected and put in a first-class condition.

Mill Creek Bridge is to be rewired and put into a proper condition for lighting—the lighting to be furnished free to the City by the Lighting Company.

There has been several changes made in the outside wiring by the different companies, and there are other changes that will be made the coming summer.

We now have a fire alarm system connected in Wards two and three, which is owned by Hose Company No. 1.

I would recommend that you take some action in extending the fire alarm system to the other wards, and connect same to the present system.

## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH.

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*To His Honor the Mayor and the Honorable Board of Aldermen, and likewise to the Honorable Citizens of South Portland:*

We submit the following report:

### FOREWORD.

The health report of a community must always stand first among the documents submitted to the consideration of an intelligent people; touching as it does the most profound, realistic and immutable laws governing human existence and tabulating conditions that modify to a very large degree the activities consequent upon such existence. Upon every man of thoughtful mien, upon every man whom nature has endowed with sufficient intelligence to wear the saddle of responsibility, rests a duty not only to his immediate generation but to subsequent generations, that he acquaint himself as largely as possible with the various avenues by which forces inimical to his continuance seek to thrust him out from the walks of life.

In this report we do hope you will find something not only interesting, but instructive.

### STATISTICS.

The total number of births reported during the year was 191; 13 of these did not survive birth, or accidents incident to birth.

Total number of deaths reported, 133. (This includes premature births).

Deaths over seventy years of age, 40. Deaths under five years of age, 14.

### CAUSES OF DEATH OCCURRING UNDER 70 YEARS.

Deaths from diseases of heart, 13; average age 47 1-2 years; youngest, 11 years. Deaths from tuberculosis, 9; average age at death, 39; youngest, 15 years. Deaths from diseases of

kidney, 5; average age at death, 52; youngest, infant \*. Deaths from apoplexy, 3; average age at death, 52; youngest, 30 years. Deaths from cancer, 4; 3 females; 1 male; average age 56 years. Deaths from intestinal trouble, infants, 5. Deaths from appendicitis, No case of death reported. (†)

#### INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

Typhoid Fever, cases reported, 5; deaths resulting, 2; ages 25 and 23. Measles, cases reported, 3; deaths resulting, 0. Scarlet Fever, cases reported, 8; deaths resulting, 1; age 24. Diphtheria, cases reported 5; deaths resulting, 0. Infantile Paralysis, cases reported, 0; deaths resulting, 0. Whooping Cough, cases reported 0; deaths resulting 2. Infantile Intestinal disease, cases reported, 0; deaths resulting, 5; average age, 5 months. Pneumonia, cases reported, 0; deaths resulting, 5.

Tuberculosis not included here.

Deaths per thousand have been slightly less than 18,†† while five and one-third out of every thousand have reached their 70th year.

The average length of life reached by the inhabitants of South Portland, using the year nineteen eleven as an index is 54 years lacking one day, which is, we believe a realization of life expectancy very much above the average.

Causes of death occurring to those over 70 years of age are so likely to be contingent upon general *systemic* conditons that they cease to be valuable except to the special inquirer, or the statistician, and hence are not enumerated above.

The greatest number of deaths have occurred in May, August and September; smallest number of deaths occurred in January, October and June.

During February, March and May, the death average of old people has been greatest while special months seem to have had little influence upon infantile mortality.

To the Secretary of this board the above report is exceedingly gratifying, for, whatever may be the feelings engendered by a general survey of other conditions in our City, in this have we evidence that we possess the greatest boon that can befall a people; a condition of healthfulness and longevity that few communities in this or any other country can equal.

The work of the board was somewhat increased this year, partially from natural increase in population and in part from greater sanitary requirements.

The number of nuisances reported and requiring special attention has been ten. A few of these have presented unpleasant features, necessitating the services of the City Solicitor. Mr. Sanborn has not only given us very valuable counsel, and other assistance of a more aggressive kind, but while permitting no infringement of the interest of the City has been very considerate of the rights and feelings of delinquents.

The annual report of schoolhouse inspection is already in your keeping, and needs no further mention here.

It was thought by this board that a register of conditions relative to the sanitation of the more congested portions of the City would be very useful, as a means of ready reference, should infectious diseases seem more prone to occur in one section of the city than others, but as data for this register could not be collected without some expense, it appeared without favor in the eyes of the City Government, and never got beyond the first installment. (See Prov. 11:24).

We can not too highly commend the faithful and efficient service of Inspector Tarling, and this board will much regret his passing. Fortunate, indeed, will be the inhabitants of our city, if the City Council succeed in appointing for them, an inspector of equal ability and unquestionable integrity.

## CITY CLERK'S REPORT.

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*To the Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council  
of South Portland, Maine:*

GENTLEMEN:—I would not characterize this statement as a report, in the sense in which that term is used as relating to the reports of the various officials and departments of the City, as embodied in the Auditor's Annual Report. I would not attempt to give to it that dignity. Contrary also to the precedent established in the report of last year, I shall not attempt to make a financial statement of the doings of this office for the period during which I have been in charge of its affairs; but would respectfully refer you to the reports of the Treasurer and Auditor, as appearing in the Annual Report for this year, for the *true* record of the receipts of this office for that period from March 17th, 1911, to January 31st, 1912, inclusive, (the date first mentioned being that when I took charge of this office, and that last mentioned being the end of the Municipal year).

The Treasurer's report shows fully the receipts of this office, as turned in to the City Treasury under the requirements of the Salary Ordinance in effect *during the last three years*, while the Auditor's report, together with the Treasurer's, shows the disposition of the same.

I apprehend that this is as it should be and in this belief I have good reason to think you agree.

I desire, however, to submit some figures showing the number of Council Meetings held during the period March 13th, 1911 (that being the date of the Inauguration of this Council) to January 31st, 1912, inclusive, (the end of the Municipal year).

A total of fifty-three (53) meetings were called — regular and special. Nine of these calls, however, were for Jury drawings, leaving forty-four (44) calls for other than Jury drawings, thereby designating meetings at which a full attendance was required or expected.

The percentage of attendance upon these forty-four (44) meetings, by the individual members of the Council, has been

exceedingly gratifying — in the instance of the Mayor and of one Alderman, being 100 per cent., or attendance upon every meeting, and in the instance of most other members of the Council being approximately 95 per cent., while in the instance of no member did the attendance fall below 90 per cent., or an attendance upon nine of every ten meetings held — certainly a most creditable showing, and a record which it will be difficult for any succeeding Council to improve upon.

I believe this to be a matter of congratulation to this Council, and a perpetual testimonial to the unselfish consideration given by its members to the duties and responsibilities of their several positions.

Attendance in many instances has been at the cost of much personal inconvenience, and in some instances real financial loss to the members of the Council, but when the calls have gone out it has been a gratifying reality that a quorum was assured, and in most instances a full Board has responded to the call.

It may be permissible in this connection, to state that the City Clerk has been absent from but one meeting in the total of fifty-three (53) which have been called during the period named, and this absence being caused by illness, was unavoidable.

If I may be permitted to refer to the work of this Council, I believe it would be right to say that it has dealt with many important issues, and that a most commendable spirit of fairness and good feeling has characterized all its sessions. To say less than this would be to say less than the whole truth, to say more is unnecessary. "Good business" has been its watch-word and if at any time best results have not been attained, I believe it has been due rather to a lack of perfect understanding and conception of duty on the part of the members of the Council, than to a lack of good intent or right purpose.

To expect that all-wisdom should be an attribute of this Council would be to expect too much, and I apprehend that no one of its members would claim for himself immunity from mistake.

A right spirit has prevailed, been encouraged, and fostered

by all. No one has been in a better position to know this truth than myself, and did I fail at this time to give public expression to my sincere appreciation of all the courtesies accorded me by this Council, both in its capacity as a deliberative body, and by its several members as individuals, I feel that I should be untrue to myself and recreant toward you. I have tried to merit the respect and confidence of the Council, such being more highly valued by me than any pecuniary advantage growing out of my association.

I shall ever look upon the past year as one of the best, if not the best year of my life, a year of growth and development in knowledge of our City's affairs, qualifying me for fuller and better citizenship among you. For this, I have you, gentlemen, to thank, and I do sincerely.

It has been my constant endeavor to administer the affairs of my office, so wisely and consistently, that it should measure up to its full efficiency, and my constant purpose to so order its work that in all things it should be in harmonious relations with and to the work of the office as carried forward by my predecessors, to the end that there should be no lost links in the chain which should bind its present business to its past, and I have used like endeavor to so fully perform its *present* work that the *future* should reveal no weaknesses therein, with resulting losses to the City, in years to come.

To the end that all this should be realized, an assistant has been employed throughout the year, and this, not at the expense of the City, as many citizens have supposed, but at a cost of some \$250 to myself, thereby reducing my net salary to little more than \$550, under the salary ordinance provision as applying to this office.

I believe it but simple justice to myself, also to the council which has voted an increase of salary for this office for another year, in their full belief that it was fully deserved, that this fact be known, together with the further fact also apparently unknown to many citizens, that I shall be obliged to hire my own assistant this year, as I did last, and at a cost undoubtedly considerably in excess of last year. It is right that the public should know and understand this truth, and with such knowledge and understanding on the part of

all, there may come less of fault finding and less of criticism for the Council's action in increasing the salary of this office.

The fees of the office for the past year have been turned into the City Treasury as required by ordinance, and will be this year, as also required.

You will bear with me if I avail myself of this opportunity to say that I am a believer in good citizenship, clean politics, civic righteousness, honest government—that I welcome all those agencies calculated to bring the realization of the benefits to be enjoyed under such government, while I deprecate and deplore all those agencies (whether within our City *or thrust upon us from without*) which tend to the destruction of such government. I believe this is the spirit of *all good citizens*, and I wish it was the spirit of all men, citizens or otherwise.

May the day be hastened when those who esteem the “muck-rake” more highly than the “harp of peace,” shall be far removed from our midst, when the promoters of discord, the breeders of ill will, the slanders, the false accusers, shall stay without, rather than come within our gates.

I have read “who steals my purse steals trash; but he who robs me of my good name, takes from me that which makes him no richer and leaves me poor indeed,” and I would append to this—he who *seeks* to rob me of my good name, though he fail in his base design, *through the falseness of his charge*, yet, is deserving only of the contempt, the scorn, and the denunciation of all just and honorable men.

Paraphrasing upon “America for Americans,” I offer to you, gentlemen of the Council, this toast, and if it appeals to your sense of fitness, I ask that you give it your indorsement:

*South Portland for South Portlanders—with a cordial welcome to all those who rightly value peace, truth, honor, self respect, and who have respect for others who are deserving of it: toleration for none who hold not these qualities of character, as essential to true manliness and decency.*

When this shall be, “politics” shall be clean, appeal to our best citizenship, and will *not* be that “unclean” thing *now forced upon us from without*, which seeks to dishonor



and disgrace us, without justification for its unwarranted charges, and without defence for its insolent interference.

May those who will not be clean, come not more among us, and of them may it soon be happily said, "The place which knew them shall know them no more." "They were not of us, and they went out from among us, to return no more forever."

If they must despoil, then may they seek new fields of despoiling, leaving us to that honorable condition of quietness and peace which it is our perfect right to insist upon, and our inherent privilege, as citizens of South Portland, to enjoy.

Let us maintain our self-respect, exercise our rights as citizens and officials, and in justice to our City and in the interests of its honor and advancement, *demand* that those who "represent" outside interests, cease to *misrepresent* us.

The following report of your City Physician is respectfully submitted.

The year has been an average one except that it has shown more clearly the need of a chance to treat some cases properly at the City Home rather than at the patients' home.

I refer particularly to a case which we have, that requires a surgical dressing every day and also to any operations requiring the use of ether.

The number of outside calls made has been 48; police calls, 2; office calls, 8; confinement cases, 3; calls at City Home, 34; operations at City Home, 2. There has been one death at the City Home.

In concluding I must thank the Board of Overseers for their hearty cooperation and lastly give the highest praise, which is their due, to the estimable man and his wife, who make the City Home what it is, a real home.

## REPORT OF COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS.

---

*To the Mayor and Board of Aldermen:*

I herewith submit my report as Commissioner of Public Works for the year ending February 1, 1912.

### STREET REPAIRS.

Sawyer Street from Middle Street to Sawyer's Brook was rounded with the road machine and surfaced with a covering of gravel from the Meeting House Hill pit, well mixed with a clay and gravel combination from the old Sawyer pit and the whole rolled with the steam roller.

That portion of Sawyer Street near the Baptist Church was repaired at the same time that the cinder sidewalk was laid and was incidental thereto.

High Street from Preble to Dyer was rounded with the road machine and surfaced with screened, uncrushed stone from the Meeting House Hill pit and rolled with the steam roller.

The section of High Street from Marriner to Dyer was crowned with the road machine.

Pine Street from High to Broadway was graveled and necessary repairs have been made in many places in Ward 7.

### ROAD MACHINE.

Pierce Street was graded with the road machine, Cottage Street from the end of the paving to the west end of Mill Creek Bridge was graded and surfaced with unscreened stone from the Meeting House Hill pit; this section of highway is one of the places in our City that should be fixed at the earliest possible day. Preble Street in Ward 1, was cleaned up with the road machine. Willard Street was graded with the road machine and graveled. Loveitt Street was cleaned up with the road machine. Some grading was done on the side of Pickett Street near Bean. Preble Street from Broadway to High was graded with the road machine and for a short distance was surfaced with cinders.

Free Street was graded with the road machine and should have a surface of gravel the first thing in the spring.

Nutter Street and Evans Street were repaired, and some gravel put on to Summer Street, but it would be better to dump the money itself there as someone might then stand some chance of getting part of it back, whereas in dumping the money in the form of gravel it is a total loss, and the same may be said of Sawyer Street below Broadway; it is time now for permanent work.

Gravel has been hauled on Cottage Street, Broadway, Meeting House Hill and many other places.

Gutters have been cleaned out in Stanford, Broadway, Preble, Hill, etc., and many minor repairs have been made.

#### NEW STREETS.

Union and Tremont Streets in Ward 7, have been graded and surfaced from Saco Road east to a proposed street.

#### CULVERTS AND DRIVEWAYS.

Culverts and driveways have been repaired when required.

#### WOOD AND EARTH SIDEWALKS.

Sidewalks have been repaired where necessary.

#### SEWERS.

The following sewers have been built this year:

Loveitt Street — Length 215 ft., cost \$110.00, contractor, W. H. Doughty.

Robinson Street — Length 200 ft., Cost \$113.00, contractor, W. H. Doughty.

Preble Street — Length 592 ft., cost \$236.95, work done by Marshall & Marshall.

Lombard Street — Length 135 ft., cost \$99.55, contractor, Matthew Woods.

Section was relaid on Ocean Street by R. E. Tuttle.

The sewer outlets on the Flats have received the usual repairs and all have been cleaned out.

Latham, Grand, Randall, Ocean, Kelsey, Preble, B and Harford's Court and other sewers have been cleaned out.

As a result in the change of grades in Ocean Street and Cottage — it was necessary to raise or lower many manholes and catch-basins and new catch-basins have been built at Randall and High, Stanford, Cottage., etc.

All catch-basins have been cleaned out, twelve new traps

were furnished and all house connections that have been reported at this office have been inspected.

#### CEMENT SIDEWALKS.

A short section was built at Smith's Corner to replace the old one which was removed when the street was widened.

The section on Cottage street from E Street to C. E. Turner's house was replaced by a new section built at the new street grade.

#### BRIDGES.

Two new Concrete Bridges were built, one on the Payne Road and one on the Cummings Road, both were built by R. E. Tuttle by contract and the price was \$993.88. In addition to the above Mr. Tuttle received \$200.00 as per contract for the approaches.

The plans for these Bridges were drawn in this office and were designed as a standard for small highway bridges to be built by the City in the future, and it is earnestly hoped that next year the bridges on Highland Ave. near Capt. Doyne's, Sawyer Street over Sawyer's Brook, and the one on Taylor Street may be replaced with this style.

#### PAVING.

The paving on Ocean Street was relaid by John W. Gulliver who was the lowest bidder, the price being \$4,128.00.

That portion between the car rails and 18 inches outside was relaid by the P. R. R. Co., and the section above the gas trench was relaid by Marshall & Marshall, the paving was relaid in a good workmanlike manner under the inspection of T. H. Payson, one of the oldest and most experience pavers in the Country, but the work will not be as even or satisfactory as it would have been had the blocks been laid on a well prepared foundation.

#### ENGINEERING AND OFFICE WORK.

Some street lines were given and some monuments were set, the map of the City was completed and the work of preparing the valuation sheets and property plans was well under way when the Council very sadly but very firmly took away all of my little tin soldiers and put me to bed.

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## REPORT OF THE CITY SOLICITOR.

In compliance with an ordinance of the City, I here submit my report as City Solicitor for the past fiscal year.

There is no action pending in any court in which the City is interested either as plaintiff or defendant at the present time; but one action has been brought by the City during the year and no suit has been brought against the City.

At the beginning of the year the action brought by E. H. Dyer and other, in equity, to prevent the payment by the City of wages earned by two aldermen was still in court and by agreement of parties the suit was dismissed, but as the question of law involved was thus squarely presented to me, I could only advise that it is contrary to law as expressed by statute and charter provision for any officer of the City to receive any money from the City for any other consideration than that of salary. I would gladly have been spared the necessity of advising upon this subject for the enforcement of the rule has deprived persons of unquestioned good faith from being paid for labor or materials furnished the City, some of them among my own best personal friends; nevertheless the law may be said on the whole to be a wise one as its purpose is to deny the opportunity for the unscrupulous to use their office as a means of receiving pay for services or materials at improper prices, in improper quantities or when not needed at all.

By far the major part of my work during the year has been advising the various city officials and more than ever before since my connection with the office these have shown a genuine disposition to perform their duties completely and as required by law; they have consulted me freely and it has been a pleasure to cooperate with them.

In one case it became necessary to bring suit under the statute to abate a nuisance where orders of the Board of Health were not heeded; the service of process accomplished the purpose and, at the time the case was called, the Court, learning that the defendant had done away with the offensive conditions, imposed only a moderate fine.

Complaint for damages was brought by Mrs. Ethel Dyer on account of raising the grade of Cottage Road; the municipal officers awarded the sum of One Hundred Dollars and the City was notified that an appeal had been taken from the award, as allowed by law, to the Supreme Court.

This appeal may be entered at the April term, and should be answered to by the City.

I believe that the City at an early day should cause actions to be commenced to obtain possession of property owned by the City by virtue of tax deeds. There is a large amount of money which the City ought to have, tied up in tax deeds, and if we cannot have payment made of the taxes thereby represented, we ought to put ourselves in position either to rent or sell the property which the City has thus been obliged to buy.

## REPORT OF BOARD OF REGISTRATION.

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*To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Aldermen:*

GENTLEMEN:—The Board of Registration of Voters respectfully submit the following statement of its work for the foregoing year:

May 1st last, the terms of the several members all expired and the Board was reorganized, to wit: Melville B. Fuller, former Chairman, was superseded by James K. Turner, reappointed and promoted Chairman, Marcus A. Hanna was reappointed in his former position, and Charles A. Tilton was appointed to fill the created vacancy. The year was what is commonly called, politically speaking, the "off year," but by Act of the 75th Legislature a "Special election" (now historical) was called for September 11th, the same as in a general election year. The Municipal election of March 6th, the Special election before mentioned, and the statutory annual session for revision, comprised the several sessions of the Board for the year.

The lists posted for the last March election carried a total of 1816 names of legal voters. In that municipal session we qualified 76 new voters, and struck off 13, making a total of 1879 names on the lists in said election.

In the annual revision session, data transmitted to us by the City assessors showed 126 less names than were borne on our lists in the previous election, and these were stricken off as having moved away or died, reducing the number posted for the Special election to 1753. Some 40 changes of residence from ward to ward were noted and confirmed in this session.

Great interest was manifest in the Special election, and in the registration incident thereto 87 new names were taken on, increasing the total to 1840, a net gain for the year of 24 voters. In preparing lists for posting thirty days prior to the pending Municipal election, further revision eliminates 14 other names, deaths, and removed from our city, leaving a total of 1826 on the lists as now posted.

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The current year will be fruitful in elections. Besides our regular Municipal election in March, the biennial State election in September, and the Presidential election in November, we will hold our first Primary election (third Monday in June) under an act adopted by the people at the Special election last September.

Voters are enjoined to inform themselves as to their duties and privileges under said Primary law, and such information as devolves upon this Board to furnish, will be duly imparted.

Next session of the Board for registration of voters and otherwise revising the lists, will begin Tuesday, February 27th, ending Saturday, March 2d, 1912. Opportunity for registration ceases, as usual at 5.00 p. m., Friday, day before closing.

## MEMORIAL DAY REPORT, 1911.

The services of Memorial Sunday were held at the Bethany Church, South Portland, which was kindly placed at our disposal by the pastor, the Rev. James G. Fisher, and the parish committee.

The auditorium of the church was filled to its utmost capacity with people anxious to do honor to the veterans and was beautifully decorated with flags and flowers.

The church choir had prepared special music for the occasion which was finely rendered and was highly appreciated by those present. Prayer was offered by the Rev. Mr. Waterworth.

The pastor, Rev. Mr. Fisher, gave us hearty words of welcome.

Miss Johnson, daughter of a veteran, read Lincoln's Gettysburg address in a very acceptable manner.

The oration by Rev. J. W. Webster, Department Commander of the G. A. R. of Maine, dealt largely with reminiscences of the Civil War and held the closest attention of the audience during its delivery.

The calling of the roll of the dead showed that the actors in the great drama of war are fast passing over to the eternal camping ground. The roll call was followed by taps or as old soldiers call it "Lights out."

The exercises closed by singing America by the choir and audience and by the benediction by the Department Commander.

### MEMORIAL DAY, MAY 30, 1911.

The various resting places of South Portland's dead soldiers and sailors of the Civil and other wars engaged in by the United States were visited and decorated by the survivors of the Civil War, accompanied by the members

of the school board, clergymen, the Temple Quartette, the school children, sons and grandsons of veterans and citizens generally.

The part taken by the schools under the direction of the chairman of the school board assisted by the teachers, was particularly pleasing, gratifying and interesting.

The ceremony of decorating the Soldiers' and Sailors' Monument was as usual participated in by both South Portland and Cape Elizabeth. Comrade John C. Ross for South Portland and Comrade Edward I. Woodbury for Cape Elizabeth, placed elegant garlands of flowers at the foot of the monument while the veterans and the schools stood with bowed and uncovered heads as they surrounded it. After appropriate songs, prayer and benediction the parade was dismissed.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

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### NOTICE TO PARENTS, HOUSEHOLDERS AND OTHER PERSONS.

There are two good reasons why you should read this carefully and remember it. One reason is that, in connection with the registration of births, marriages and deaths, the law says that parents, householders and some other persons shall do certain things, and provides penalties for those who fail to comply with the requirements of the law. Another reason is that it is very important to individuals, to families, and to the State, that births, marriages and deaths be promptly, full and accurately recorded.

The following are some of the requirements of the law relating to the registration of births, marriages and deaths:

**BIRTHS.**—The attending physician, midwife or other person in charge shall report the birth, living or stillborn, to the City Clerk within six days.

Parents, householders, keepers of workhouses, houses of correction, of prisons, of hospitals, of almshouses or of other institutions and the commanding officers of ships shall give notice of every birth or death happening among the persons under their charge.

(Blanks for reports may be obtained from the City Clerk, or by addressing: State Registrar, Augusta, Maine.)

**MARRIAGES.**—Intentions of marriage shall be recorded by the City Clerk five days before the certificate of marriage is granted.

Intentions of marriage must be recorded in both Cities when the parties to the marriage live in different Cities.

The certificate (or certificates) made out by the City Clerk (or City Clerks) must be received by the clergyman or justice of the peace before performing the marriage.

Every person authorized to unite persons in marriage

shall make a record of every marriage solemnized before him, and in conformity with the provisions prescribed upon the blank certificates of marriage, shall, within six days, deliver or forward to the Clerk of each City in which the marriage intention was recorded, and to the Clerk of the City in which the marriage was solemnized, a copy of such record of marriage.

When residents of this State go into another State for the purpose of marriage, and it is there solemnized, and they return to dwell here, they shall file a certificate or declaration of their marriage with the Clerk of the City in which each of them then lived, within seven days after their return, or forfeit ten dollars, half to the prosecutor and half to the town where the forfeiture is incurred. (Sec. 7, Chap. 61, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.)

**DEATHS.**—The undertaker, household, neighbor or other person removing the body or superintending the burial shall furnish the City Clerk with a certificate giving the facts called for in the blank certificate of death, including the certificate of the physician as to the cause of death.

If the deceased person has not had the attendance of a physician, the City Clerk may issue the death certificate upon the receipt of the required facts.

(The facts required may be learned from the blank "death certificate" obtainable from any physician, undertaker or City Clerk or by writing to: State Registrar, Augusta, Maine.)

On presentation of this certificate of death, a "burial permit" will be issued by the City Clerk or one of the sub-registrars.

This burial permit must be returned to the City Clerk of the City in which the death occurred within six days after the burial.

**FALSE RETURNS.**—The law provides that "it shall be a misdemeanor for any person to make a false return in regard to any birth or death."

**DUTY OF PHYSICIANS.**—"A physician who has attended a person during his last illness shall within twenty-four

hours after the death of said person make a certificate stating, to the best of his knowledge and belief, the name of the deceased, his age, the disease of which he died and the date of his death, and shall either deliver it to the person superintending the burial, or leave it with the family of the deceased or at the said physician's office where it may be obtained when called for."

**DUTY OF ASSESSORS.**—For the principal purpose of obtaining the names of children whose names have not otherwise been reported, the law provides that "the assessors shall, when taking the annual inventory, collect and return to the City Clerk, before the first day of June, the births which have occurred within their respective jurisdictions during the year ending December thirty-first next preceding, together with the names of such children."

There are various reasons which cannot be stated here why parents should be particular to have the birth of every child correctly recorded, including the name. Assure yourself that your physician has attended to his duty; otherwise, it will be necessary to hold you, as well as him, responsible as a lawbreaker. You have a twofold responsibility here; your duty under the law and your duty to your child and your family.

The law makes it the duty of the City and Town Clerks and of the State Registrar to enforce the provisions of this law.

**NOTE:** The term "City Clerk" wherever used in the foregoing, is used as a *general term*, denoting either *City* or *Town* clerk as the case may be.

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There have been returned to the City Clerk's office, for record, during the municipal year ending January 31st, 1912, a total of 186 births, 74 marriages and 149 deaths.

**NOTE:** (The difference in figures as given in the report of the Board of Health, is accounted for by the fact that that report covers the *calendar* year ending Dec. 31, 1911, while this report, as will be noted, covers the *municipal* year ending Jan. 31st, 1912.

# Appendix.

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## RULES OF THE CITY COUNCIL.

SEC. 1. The presiding officer shall take the chair promptly at the time appointed for the meeting, and having called the Council to order, and a roll-call showing a quorum present, shall proceed at once to business.

SEC. 2. He shall be entitled to speak on questions of order, but not on any other question when occupying the chair; shall decide all questions of order subject to an appeal to the Council, declare all votes, preserve order and decorum, and shall appoint all committees unless they are otherwise provided for.

SEC. 3. When stating a question or motion, or when addressing the Council, the presiding officer shall rise, but may read sitting.

SEC. 4. When a question is under debate no motion shall be in order except the following:

1. To adjourn.
2. The previous question.
3. To commit.
4. To amend.
5. To postpone indefinitely.
6. To lay on the table.

SEC. 5. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order except when immediately repeated.

SEC. 6. The following questions shall be decided without debate:

1. To adjourn.
2. The previous question.
3. All questions of order and appeals from the decision of the chair thereon.
4. To lay on the table.

SEC. 7. When a vote has been passed, any member who voted in the majority may move a reconsideration of said vote at the same, or at the next succeeding regular meeting, but not afterward, but a vote to reconsider shall require a majority of all the members of the Council.

SEC. 8. Every member present shall vote unless specially excused by the Council before the vote is taken.

SEC. 9. A motion to commit shall take precedence of all amendments of the main question.

SEC. 10. Every motion shall be reduced to writing if any member shall so request.

SEC. 11. The enacting form as an ordinance shall be as follows: "Be it ordained by the City Council." The form of an order shall be as follows: "In City Council, Ordered," etc. The form of a resolve shall be: "In City Council, Resolved," etc.

SEC. 12. When a vote is doubted, the members for and against the motion shall rise when called upon by the presiding officer and remain standing until counted.

SEC. 13. No member shall speak more than twice on the same question at any one meeting, unless by permission of the Council.

SEC. 14. The Council may resolve itself into committee of the whole on any question and the presiding officer shall appoint a member who shall occupy the chair.

SEC. 15. Special committees of the Council shall report within one month, unless further time is granted.

SEC. 16. When a member wishes to speak, he shall rise and address the presiding officer, and not proceed until recognized by the chair. He shall confine himself to the question under discussion and avoid intemperate and abusive language.

SEC. 17. The Clerk shall keep a record of all votes, orders, ordinances and other proceedings of the Council in a journal; shall prepare and present to the Mayor all votes, ordinances and documents requiring his signature, unless the Council shall otherwise direct; shall notify, or cause to be notified, all members of the Council of the time of special meetings, as provided by the charter; and shall perform such other duties, not inconsistent with the charter, as the Council may from time to time prescribe.

SEC. 18. All by-laws passed by the City Council shall be styled ordinances, and shall receive at least two readings before they are finally passed to be ordained, not more than one of which reading shall be at the same meeting of the City Council; and all amendments, alterations or repeals of ordinances shall be made in the same manner and subject to the same number of readings as original ordinances.

SEC. 19. None of these rules or orders shall be suspended unless by a two-thirds vote of the members present; and such suspension shall continue only during the meeting at which such vote is taken; and no rule or order shall be altered or repealed unless written notice shall have been given at a preceding meeting, nor unless a majority of all the members of the Council vote to so alter or repeal.

SEC. 20. All questions of order not herein provided for shall be decided by the presiding officer subject to an appeal to the Council.

### ORDER OF BUSINESS.

The following shall be the order of business unless when otherwise determined by the Council:

1. Roll-call.
2. Reading of minutes.
3. Unfinished business.
4. Orders of the day.
5. Reports of the committees.
6. New business.
7. Adjournment.
