Hi Tim,

My HTY 462 (American Revolution) in spring 2020 did a unit on smallpox in the Revolutionary Era that was not part of the course as initially planned. Basically students did a short reading from Elizabeth Fenn's Pox Americana (2001) and online research with two online databases: one an extension of Fenn's book, the other a large digitized collection of Founding Fathers' papers. The post-spring break syllabi, a PDF of the smallpox-based required reading, and screenshots from the two required databases are attached.

In Fall 2020 my HTY 103 (US History to 1877) will give greater attention to the demographic catastrophe that was central to colonization. I am waiting until I understand the parameters of our fall teaching modifications before I do any substantial revision to the course.
