### HOW OUR ADDED MONEY RACE PLAN REALLY WORKS

An example:

Our Purse .....	\$300
Assuming 6 starters @ \$10 .....	60
Actual Purse .....	\$360
10% Set Aside for Winners .....	36
Remainder of Purse .....	\$324

\$324 Divided for Three Heats \$108 Per Heat

\$108 Divided 50% 25% 15% 10%

Equals, Per Heat \$54 \$27 \$16.20 \$10.80

Assuming Summary at End of Third Heat Is:

1—1—1      2—2—2      3—3—3      4—4—4

Amount Received: Winner, \$198 (3 times \$54, plus \$36); Second, \$81 (3 times \$27); Third, \$48.60 (3 times \$16.20; Fourth, \$32.40 (3 times \$10.80). These same amounts are charged against your horse on your eligibility certificate. A horse finishing fourth in one heat receives more than the starting fee.
