**Tanglewood online festival - Emanuel Ax performs an all-Beethoven program**

**July 11 at 8 p.m. through July 18**

Tanglewood is among the internationally renowned festivals that have moved online. Mainstay Emanuel Ax performs an all-Beethoven program featuring two of the composer's earliest sonatas, and the composer's poignant bagatelle known as "Für Elise."



**Metamorphosen Saturday, July 11**

This is the full performance of Britain's first orchestra concert since lockdown. This elegy for 23 solo string players (10 violins, 5 violas, 5 celli, 3 double basses) was composed during the closing months of WW2 by Richard Strauss, who took up his pen the day after the Vienna opera was destroyed. **Saturday, July 4, 8 p.m.**

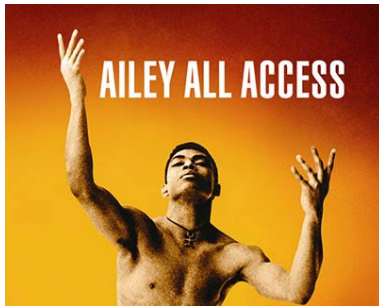
