SOME MAINE FORESTER FACTS:

--- The first editor of **The Maine Forester** was Gregory Baker. He received his Bachelor of Science in 1924 at The University of Maine. After receiving his Master of Forestry at Yale, working as Supervisor for Diamond Match Co., and then Manager of Provincial Wood Products Co., Saint John, New Brunswick, he followed his "roots" home to Maine. He was an Instructor of Forestry (1935 - 1942), and then Professor from 1951 -1971.

--- The first publication of **The Maine Forester** was in 1923, but the second was not until 1927.

--- The Forestry Club (now The Student Chapter of The Society of American Foresters) was the group that started **The Maine Forester**. **The Maine Forester** has since become an entity of its own.

---- The Forestry Wives Club, now dissolved, showed us the "feminine side of forestry" in 1953. The wife is "a necessary part. Ask any forester! He'll tell you he couldn't get along without the little woman." He also "depends on her to be right on hand, ready to lend assistance or support ..."

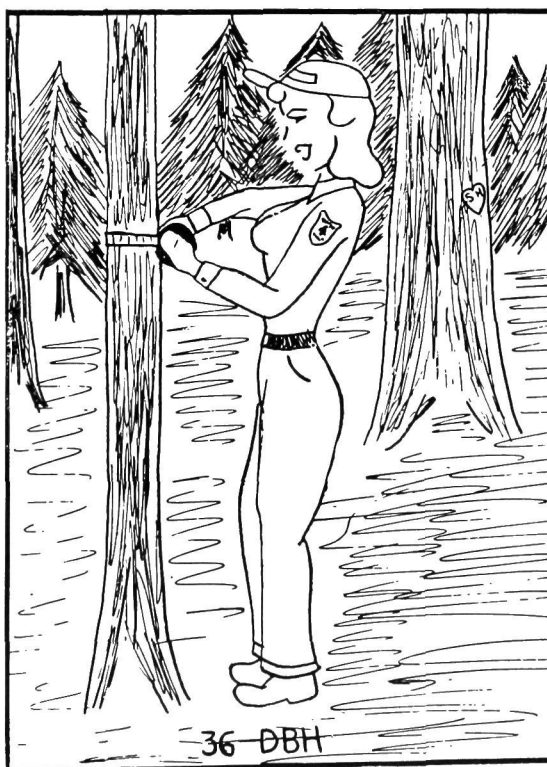
--- **The Maine Forester** has twice had brother and sister editors. Cindy Gamron in 1989, and Ted Gamron in 1990, and 1991. Neil Brackley was editor for the 1991 - 1992 edition, and Kelley Brackley in 1993 - 1994.



--- The cover of the first **The Maine Forester** has been reproduced three times; once in 1927, once in 1981, and again in 1993-1994 to celebrate its 70th year of existence.

--- The 1980's was the only decade that **The Maine Forester** was published each year.

--- If there had been more females studying forestry in 1954, this drawing may never have been published.



THE SECRET OF THE JAY

I was looking for a way to dispose of the remainder of my dinner, when a flock of Canada Jays started to pick the scraps from the T-bone set a little to the side of my firepit.

I asked the Jays if they would like some dinner, and one of them said, "We'll try anything once." So I gave them a platefull of what I had left, and they proceeded to eat. As they continued I said, "I'm new in these parts and like you, from the East, it sure is good to see some friends. How long have you been in these parts?" One rather senior looking Jay replied, "We came west many years ago with a fellow named Bunyon. Yes, P. Bunyon was his name I think." After a pause he continued, "Mr. Bunyon and his kind, like us, were creatures of the woods. We owe them a lot. It was the winter of 1867 or 68 and we were new to these parts and starving. The woodsmen shared what little they had with us. Ever since we have provided them with friendship." He said, "The woodsmen are creatures of the forest, like us you know."

I told the bird he spoke well and commended him for his knowledge of the language.

The bird cocked his head and said, "It is only the people of the woods that can understand the language we speak and they are sworn to secrecy. If the people of the city knew we could speak, they would capture us and treat us like dancing bears. They know nothing of our roots." I assured my friend that their secret would never be told.

As they finished their meal they said, "The secret must never be told, but tell those that you love that they will know where their life's work lay, when they can understand the language of the Jay."

The Canada Jay of North America is found in both the eastern and western areas of the northern forest. They are commonly called the "Woodsmen's Friend". Never harm them for they contain the soul of a departed woodsman.

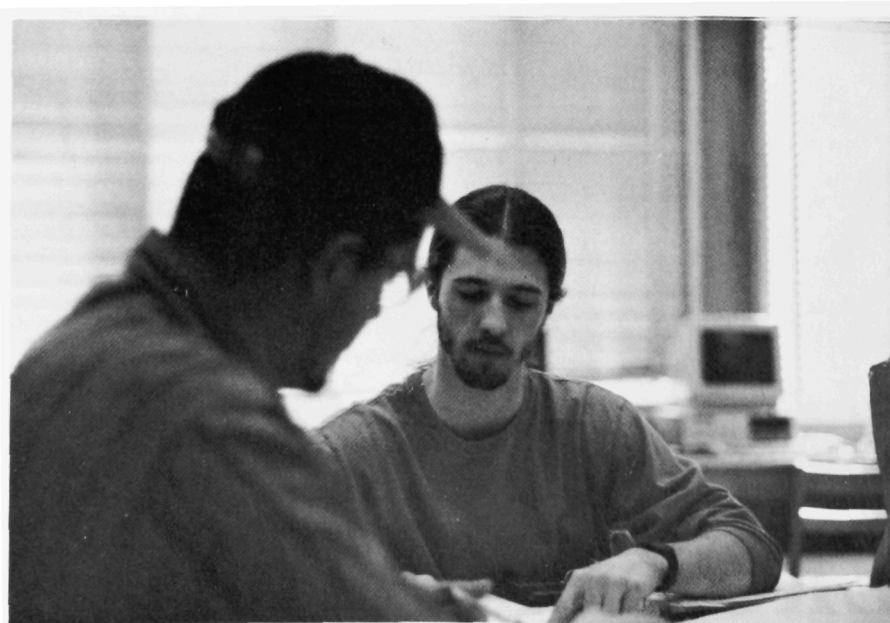
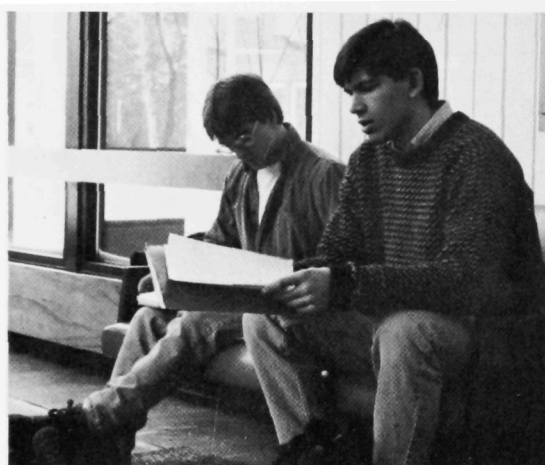
