### NOTES BY SELECTMEN

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We accepted a very fine collection of shells and curios, willed by the late Charles F. Collins of Rockport, Maine, and a former resident of Castine. As soon as possible these will be checked and placed in one case in the Wilson Museum.

Conditions are such that we suggest appropriations at the annual meeting be limited to such amounts as are actually needed. There are several items which can be reduced much below the figures of last year, without injury or loss.

Town meeting Monday, March 16, at 8:45 in the forenoon. A moderator will first be chosen. He will then declare the polls open from 9 o'clock in the forenoon until 1 o'clock in the afternoon for the election, by secret ballot, of three selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor, treasurer, collector, school committee, fire chief, road commissioner and town clerk.

Regular business will be taken up immediately thereafter. Unless you are particularly interested in the election of a moderator, it will not be necessary to go to the meeting except in time to ballot before 1 o'clock in the afternoon, at which time the polls will close.

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Town books close each year February 20. Taxes are assessed April 1, and due when bill is received. Dog taxes are due and payable April 1, to the town clerk.

If you have purchased or sold real estate during the past year, or property listed as "heirs" or "devisees" should now be in your name, please notify the assessors before April 1.

If your tax for 1941 is unpaid, be sure to forward the amount due plus 6 per cent. from August 1, 1941, before April 1, 1942, otherwise a tax lien will be placed on the property. By doing so you will save the additional expenses of a tax lien.

## REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

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To the Citizens of Castine:

The number of books in circulation during the past year was 8,735. Of this number, 1,757 were non-fiction, an increase over last year. More books were bought and presented to the library than in previous years.

## SCHOOL REPORT

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To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of Castine:

I herewith submit my fourth annual report as superintendent of schools.

A recent survey shows, we have 101 children in actual attendance in our schools, forty-two in the high school and fifty-nine in the grade schools. I have asked Miss Leslie to prepare a brief statement in regard to the grades. The high school is divided by classes as follows: Freshmen, 14; Sophomores, 9; Juniors, 13; Seniors, 6. The present small enrollment in our schools is brought about by the fact that several families have moved to other towns or cities, where the parents are engaged in war work.

These pupils have been given courses which meet with the approval of the State Department of Education, and have shown themselves sufficiently proficient in their studies before being promoted from one grade to the next.

The closing of the Eastern State normal school eliminates the use of its training school for the children in the grades from sub-primary to eighth. The superintending school committee has made a study of the possibilities in regard to housing the schools, and has decided the best procedure is to repair and renovate the grammar school building. Fortunately some work has already been done on the building during the past summer, when nearly the whole eastern wall of the basement was renewed. With more repairs and alterations this building will have adequate floor space, good lighting, and ample toilet facilities to house all the grade school children. Tentative estimates at present prices set the cost of these repairs at \$2,000.

It is regrettable that several changes will need to be made in the teaching force, and necessary supplies and equipment will depend on what is acquired of the materials now in use at the training school. It will be understood that the realignment of our school program takes place at a time when costs of material and labor are high, and teachers' salaries rising.

Plans for the high school are for an economic program without interfering with the standards which we have endeavored to set up and maintain, in spite of higher salary levels for satisfactory teachers, and rising costs of supplies. It is believed that the present program can be maintained at the high school with the same appropriations as last year. Moreover, we can lower the appropriations for repairs by \$250, since no insurance premiums are due this year.

It will be understood that the school committee has carefully studied the probable expenditures for the coming year and makes the following recommendations:

**TRAINING SCHOOL**

At present there are 79 pupils enrolled in the Castint training school. Thirty-one children are transported by bus from North Castine, 28 children come from the village and the remainder are sent from the town of Penobscot. There has been much absence among the pupils, on account of sickness during the months of January and February. Seven pupils are enrolled in the eighth grade.

The usual assistance has been given by the Woman's Club, Needlework Guild, Lion's Club and Red Cross. The Red Cross has supplied milk. We appreciate the interest taken by the parents in the seven-point health program which is conducted by the State Department of Health. In order to qualify for a certificate a child must measure up to certain health standards determined by physical inspection on the following points: Vision, hearing, teeth, throat, weight, good postural habits and birth registration.

## NURSE'S REPORT

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To the Selectmen, Town of Castine:

I herein submit a brief report of services rendered the town of Castine by the Hancock County Health Service from February 1, 1941, to February 1, 1942.

The schools of Castine—the high, grammar, training school, from the sub-primary to and including the sixth grades—have been visited each month during the school year, at which times classroom inspections were given. Individual inspection was given those who were absent at the time the previous annual inspection was given, and a check-up made of the pupils eligible to qualify for the Seven-Point Pins and Certificates.

During April the Early Diagnosis Tuberculosis posters and pamphlets were distributed through the schools and public places, each pamphlet carrying to the home an educational message of vital importance.

We have been unable to have the usual tuberculin testing and chest X-ray clinic this year, due to the work of Miss Gay, the clinic nurse, with the Selective Service Board. Two dates have been set, but each time the date has had to be cancelled.

The Castine branch of the Hancock County American Red Cross has sponsored and financed a dental reparative clinic for some of the school pupils. Ten pupils were conveyed to Dr. Gould's office in Bucksport, later being returned to their homes with completed dental work.

We have not been without the usual run of children's diseases, many children being absent from school with the measles.

One young boy in school seemed to have some difficulty in reading. The teacher seemed to think it was possibly due to poor vision. This child was conveyed to an eye specialist in Bangor for eye refraction, but the specialist stated his vision was above the average.

The annual physical inspection has been given the sub-primary, to and including the sixth grades, the grammar, and

high school, which consisted of the usual routine weighing and measuring, the Snellen's test for vision, the whisper test for hearing, the inspection of teeth, throat, scalp, and for postural defects, the skin for rashes and sores, personal cleanliness, as well as for symptoms of infectious diseases.

The result is as follows: Number of pupils who have defective vision, 1; eye strain, 1; inflamed eyelids, 3; defective hearing, 1; decayed teeth, 46; abnormal throat, 3; obstruction of nose, 3; swollen glands, 1; unclean scalp, 3; nervous condition (biting nails), 7; 10 per cent. or more underweight, 6; 20 per cent or more overweight, 11.

Of the 105 pupils inspected, 49 were found to have defects. Fifty-six were eligible to qualify for the Seven-Point Pins and Certificates. Of the 46 pupils having decayed teeth, 12 have decay of the permanent, 34 of the temporary, 2 needing prophylactic cleaning, due to the formation of tartar on the teeth.

Since previous inspections there have been the following corrections: Vision, 4; hearing, 2; tonsil and adenoid operations, 3, and 48 dental corrections.

Time and space will not allow the recording in this brief report of all the activities and the many visits made during the year or the numerous phases of the work in a county service.

The ways and means by which the work of the Hancock County Health Service is met is through the sale of Christmas Seals, and by town appropriations. We wish to express our sincere thanks and appreciation to all who have in any way assisted in the work of the Hancock County Health Service, for without which we would be unable to carry on.

**ANNUAL REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING—1941**

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Because Castine is fortunate in having a nurse to do special work in the schools, my part of the public health program has been directed to the maternal and child health work.

Realizing today, as never before, that the health and welfare of the child begins with the care of the pregnant mother, twenty visits have been made to pre-natal and post-partum patients. Eleven different patients have been contacted.

To help mothers with child health problems, health supervision visits have been made. During the year seventy-four home visits were made and forty-six different infant and pre-school children were contacted.

In May a well-child conference, sponsored by the Woman's Club, was held. Twenty infants and pre-school children attended. Diphtheria and smallpox immunization was offered at that time. Seventeen immunizations were given. Miss Rogers, the home demonstration agent, was present to help mothers with nutritional problems.

In November, two home nursing classes were started. These were held weekly at the Community House.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the splendid cooperation that has been given me. It is indeed gratifying to find increasing interest in the health and welfare of the pregnant mother, the infant and the pre-school child.
