NOTES BY SELECTMEN

Town meeting Monday, March 15, at 8:45 in the forenoon. A moderator will first be elected. The polls will be open from nine o'clock in the forenoon until one o'clock in the afternoon, for the election by ballot of three selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor, treasurer, collector, school committee, fire chief, road commissioner and town clerk.

Town books close each year February 20. Taxes are assessed April 1, and due when bill is presented. Six per cent. interest is charged on taxes overdue. Dog taxes are due and payable to town clerk on April first.

It is necessary that you report to the assessors before April 1, any property which you have purchased or sold.

REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

To the Citizens of Castine:

The trustees of the Witherle Memorial Library submit herewith their annual report. The number of books in circulation was 8420. While this is somewhat less than last year, it is considered to be a large circulation, under present conditions, as so many people are away. Of the books taken out, 1557 were non-fiction.

Books were given by Mrs. Marion Butler, the Misses Slade, Dr. Alice North, Miss Trumbull, Mrs. Elizabeth Lummis, Mrs. William White, Mrs. John Lawson, Mr. Mikell, Mrs. Farnsworth, Mrs. Tucker, Miss Geneva Blodgett, Mr. Francis Hatch, Mrs. Robert Bowden, Mrs. Brimley, Mary Cutler, Dr. Pierce, Mrs. Linnard, Mr. Charles Richardson, jr., and Admiral Dismukes.

The trustees wish to thank these people for their generous gifts.

W. D. Hall presented a Normal School Year Book, for the year 1942, and also School Catalogues dating from 1885. These will be particularly valuable to former students of the Eastern State Normal School.

Magazines were given by George Richardson, the Misses Slade, Mrs. William Hooke, Mrs. Latimer, Miss Walworth and Miss Lamphrey. The trustees extend their thanks to all these donors.

Several books have been received as gifts from the publishers.

Sums of money were received from Mrs. Clausing, Mrs. Brocklebank, Miss Charlotte Stuhe and Mrs. Latimer. Miss Winslow gave six dollars for magazines.

Books were collected at the Library in the Victory Book Campaign, for soldiers, and were delivered to the Bangor Public Library by Mr. Hall.

The following legacies were made to the Library during the year — from Caroline Dresser Witherle, \$15,000, to be called the John W. Dresser Fund, and \$1,000 from Annie Gay Page. These funds will be invested by the trustees as soon as received.

The trustees recommend that \$600 be raised for library maintenance and fifty cents per taxable poll for library increase.

At the present time, in addition to the money in the bank, as shown in the financial report, the library trustees hold the following securities:

SCHOOL REPORT

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Castine:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report as superintendent of schools.

As is well known, the closing of the Eastern State Normal School made it necessary to find a place for the grade schools of the town. The grammar school building, so called, was renovated, and the downstairs room was divided so that three rooms were available. New toilet rooms have been built, and a central entrance and stairway installed. Window space was enlarged and new electric fixtures were put in so that the building meets all State requirements. With the enrollment as it is the building is adequate for all present needs. The heating equipment is not very satisfactory but it is doubtful that any change can be made for the duration.

Both the high and common schools are fortunate in having excellent teachers, with comparatively few changes in personnel. Not only have these teachers done satisfactory school work, but they have also helped out in civilian defense, the Victory program and rationing.

During the winter term a hot lunch program has been carried on in the grade school building. This has been in charge of Mrs. Jennie Dickson. Her services have been paid for by contributions from the Lions Club, Eastern Star and local Red Cross. Supplies have been furnished by contributions from the parents and from the Federal Foods Administration. The program is particularly in need of fresh vegetables. The driver of the school bus will be glad to bring to the school any donations by interested parties.

In planning a budget for the coming year the committee is faced with many uncertainties. However, best estimates that can be made at this time call for the following expenditures:

High school	\$4,800.00
Common schools	3,800.00
Text-books and supplies, light, water	800.00
Conveyance (including high school) ..	1,500.00
Repairs and insurance	800.00
Superintendent's salary	400 00

It will be noted that this budget is something over \$1,000 less than the expenditures for the year just ending.

In closing this report I call to the attention of the parents and townspeople that in a period of war turmoil and economic interruptions our schools are functioning in very nearly a normal manner. I believe this is due to an excellent teaching force and an alert interest in our schools.

Thank you for this opportunity to report.

NURSE'S REPORT

To the Selectmen of the Town of Castine:

I hereby submit a brief report of services rendered the town by the Hancock County Health Service for the period February 1, 1942, to February 1, 1943.

During April the Early Diagnosis Tuberculosis Campaign posters and pamphlets were distributed through the schools and public places, each pamphlet, carrying to the homes a vital health message, to be passed on to others to read.

During the year seventeen visits have been made to the town of Castine and the schools, Castine high, grammar, intermediate, grades, and primary school, at which times classroom inspections were given and a check-up made of pupils eligible to qualify for the Seven-Point Pin and Certificate. Individual inspections were given those who were absent when the annual inspection was given.

Visits were made to chronic patients, and services rendered whenever possible.

The Red Cross Branch of the Hancock County American Red Cross has sponsored and financed dental corrections in the past. This year four pupils were conveyed to and from Dr. Gould's office at Bucksport by the county nurse.

The annual physical inspection was given the primary pupils on September 29, the intermediate grades on October 7, the high and grammar school students on November 7, which consisted of routine weighing and measuring, the test for vision and hearing, inspection of teeth, throat, for postural defects, the skin for rashes and sores, for personal cleanliness, as well as for symptoms of infectious diseases. The result is as follows: Number of pupils who have defective vision, 1; inflamed eyelids, 1; decayed teeth, 34; abnormal throat, 4; obstruction of nose, 4; swollen glands, 1; defective speech, 1; biting fingernails (nervous), 4; 10 lbs. or more underweight, 2; 20 lbs. or more overweight, 6.

Of the thirty-four pupils having decayed teeth, fourteen have decay of the permanent, twenty-four of the temporary, and five needing prophylactic cleaning.

Of the ninety-one inspected, fifty-five were found with defects, thirty-six were eligible to qualify for the Seven-Point Pin and Certificate. Since previous inspections there have

been the following corrections made: Vision (glasses provided), 3; diseased tonsils and adenoids removed, 6; hearing, 1; teeth, 31.

The service rendered the many towns of Hancock County by the Hancock County Health Service is financed through the sale of the Christmas Seals and by the town appropriations. The county service is grateful to the citizens who make this possible.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE—1942

Public health nursing is concerned with the health of the community as a whole. Because Castine is fortunate in having a nurse employed by another agency to do school work my part of the health program has been directed primarily to the maternal and infant and pre-school work.

During the year seven different pre-natal and post-partum patients have been seen. Eighteen visits have been made.

Forty-five child health supervision calls have been made to infant and pre-school children.

Two home nursing classes were completed in April with a high percentage finishing the course.

In April a Well-Child Conference was held. Sixteen children attended. Twelve immunizations for diphtheria and smallpox were given at that time.

In November a community typhoid immunization clinic sponsored by the local health committee was held. A total of one hundred and twenty-eight people were immunized.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the splendid co-operation I have received and the interest that has been shown, by the doctor, health committee, and general public. It is indeed gratifying. We can look forward to next year hoping for continued progress as time goes on.
